New Caribou Coffee Open, Concourse A.

Pick up your favorite fresh-brewed hot or cold beverage and food to go with it, from breakfast pastries to salads, sandwiches and snacks. Find everything Caribou in this new convenient spot – Food Court, Concourse A.

New Handicapped & Special Needs Complimentary Shuttle Bus between Humphrey and Lindbergh Terminals.

For travelers with mobility constraints who may find it difficult to walk the distance between the Humphrey Terminal and its LRT station, we've made it easier to travel between the two terminals. A specially marked bus departs from the Lindbergh Transit Center and the Humphrey Ground Transportation Center – look for signs with a wheelchair symbol at each location. Service is daily every 20 minutes, beginning 6a.m. at Lindbergh, last bus departing Lindbergh at 9:40p.m.

Time Spent at the Airport

In addition to award-winning shopping and dining, MSP Airport is filled with sites and adventures just waiting to be discovered.

It's 6a.m., or 2p.m., or 8p.m. You made it through security in record time. Or you've got a 3-hour layover. Or you took a bump for a free ticket on a later flight. Whatever the reason, if you've got time to spare, take advantage of it. You've got some exploring to do!

Best place to feel like you're not at the airport: Slip into a booth in the back room at Ike's, and you could be anywhere—an urban roadhouse, or that little bistro you love in D.C. Booths have built-in luggage storage to further the non-airport ambience, and people actually look relaxed. Not hungry? Find one of the massage chairs near the Airport Barber on Concourse D, and close your eyes for a few minutes of heaven. You deserve it! **Ike's Food & Cocktails**, Lindbergh Main Terminal.

Best place to warm up and chill out: The MSP Airport has 4—count 'em, 4—fireplaces, each with their own appeal. Coziest spot: the brick hearth at **Itasca Grille**, Concourse A, where log chairs and map-topped tables offer a cabin-y backdrop and you can choose from a long list of beers or wine. At the Humphrey Terminal, find the **Caribou Coffee** outside Baggage Claim, order your latté of choice and sink into one of the fireside lounge chairs with a favorite magazine.

Best place to work: Need to finish up a presentation or call your boss? **Airport Service Centers**, with locations on every concourse, are definitely up to the task. Here you can corral your own cubicle

with data ports beyond the fray for some quality screen time. The airport's internet service is easily accessed, and you can even turbo-charge your phone so it's juiced for wherever you'll touch down next. Need stamps, or want to send a last-minute Fedex? Can do.

Best place to entertain the kids: Kids age 7 or under will enjoy the play area near gate C12 (and near H6 at the Humphrey Terminal) where they can work off some energy climbing into the "747" or having their photo taken in front of the peek-a-boo cut-outs. (All children must be accompanied by an adult.) Older kids and teens will happily hang out in the **Lucky Lindy** (Concourse F) or **Aurora Borealis** (Concourse C) arcades, each with over a dozen attractions. Adults have been known to play the old-school pinball and Pac-Man machines. Waka-waka!

Best place to see the runway: Enjoy a 360° view of the airport and runway on Concourse D. Look for the **Observation Deck** sign on your left, and climb the stairs-only access to the viewing area. While there is no seating, it's fun to watch the planes taxi in and out, and the kids will be fascinated to



Best place to get some exercise: In partnership with the American Heart Association, MSP Airport unveiled its **Start! walking program** in August, offering a fun way to turn "down time" into fitness time. The 1.4-mile route cruises from gate C1 down Concourse C, across the Concourse Skyway Connector, up Concourse G, and through the main shopping and dining area—a perfect 20 to 40 minute power-walk/stroll. Look up for the circular green mileage markers to track your progress. Extra points if you're toting a laptop or carry-on bag.

Best distraction from everything else: Rent a DVD movie at **InMotion Entertainment**, Lindbergh Main Terminal, then load it onto your laptop, plug in your headphones and zone out. Better yet, rent two and watch one during your flight. Returns are simple: drop DVDs off at any of 53 locations nationwide, bring them back on your return flight, or send via UPS.

Food Favorites at MSP Airport

Everyone has their favorite foods. And they love to talk about them. So we took a casual poll and cooked up a list that's certainly not all encompassing. But it's definitely an enticing place to start assembling your own list of great dining at MSP Airport. What could be more delicious?



Best Fajitas.

Yes, they're the only fajitas at MSP Airport, and they're incredible. An aromatic, sizzling presentation of either chicken or steak mixed with sautéed red and green peppers and onions, the large platter arrives in a cloud of steam, surrounded by housemade guacamole and salsa, rice accented with bits of carrots, housemade pinto beans and warm grilled tortillas. Olé! Fajitas, \$14; **Axel's Bonfire**, Lindbergh Main Terminal. (1)

Best Organic Eating.

MSP Airport is the only airport in the U.S. with a restaurant and bar dedicated to organic food, wine and spirits – the French Meadow Bakery & Café. Loads of menu choices stand out, but a consistent favorite is the

Roasted Beet and Pear Salad. Even if you didn't gravitate toward beets as a kid, these will win you over. Maybe it's the combination of warm roasted beets, warm caramelized pears, crumbled blue cheese and balsamic vinaigrette over organic baby greens. Or maybe it's just knowing that something so yummy is also so good for you. \$8.99; **French Meadow Bakery & Café**, Lindbergh Main Terminal and Concourse F. (2)

Best Meal in a Glass.

Chances are you haven't met a Bloody Mary like the Weekender (despite the name, it's served every day). The skewered garnishes are a virtual salad – a hefty fresh shrimp, a jumbo chunk of cheddar cheese, a bite of jerky, black and green olives,

a spicy green jalapeño, leafy celery stalk, giant dill pickle, pearl onion and a wedge of lime. All suspended in a custom-made, perfectly spiced and shaken drink with a beer chaser. A filling eye-opener any time of day, \$10.99; **Ike's Food & Cocktails**, Lindbergh Main Terminal. (3)

Meatiest Low-Fat Sandwich.

Subway's Roast Beef or Oven Roasted Chicken Breast "Fresh Fit" sandwiches are hefty meals that your stomach would never register as under 6 grams of fat if you didn't already know it. Choose your bread, pile on the veggies and delight in eating healthy, \$0.00 – \$0.00; **Subway**, Lindbergh Main Terminal.

Largest Burrito Selection.

It's a virtual tie between Maui Taco and 360° Gourmet Burritos. Both feature a diverse menu of creative choices for meat lovers and vegetarians alike. And breakfast versions are not to be missed. All are easily portable for carrying on a flight if you don't have time to dig in on the spot. **Maui Taco**, Concourse C; **360° Gourmet Burritos**, Lindbergh Main Terminal.

Closest to Italy.

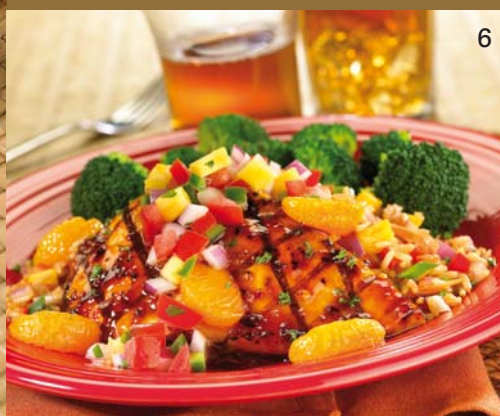
If Locanda D'Amico didn't have such an elegantly contemporary interior, you'd think it was part of old world Italy. That's how much the menu choices will remind you of the small inns and family restaurants travelers search out on their trips to Italy. Expect crisp cracker-thin pizza crusts, fresh pastas and entrees you can't get enough of. Like the Chicken Scallopini with Prosciutto and Linguine, \$17.99; **Locanda D'Amico**, Concourse F. (4)

Most Artful Seafood.

Watch skilled sushi chefs create nutritious works of art with the freshest ingredients. Then savor the results of their labor in a dazzling array of sushi choices. One of the most popular is the Rainbow Roll of tuna, salmon, cucumber, avocado and cooked rice, \$11.08; **Wok & Roll**, Lindbergh Main Terminal and Concourses C & E. (5)

Most Enticing Menu Change.

An entire page of Friday's menu is dedicated to "Right Portions, Right Prices" – terrific, value-priced alternatives to what many consider the super-sizing of restaurant food. Hearty and satisfying, they're a full meal without the annoying doggie bag. There are four to try – Bistro Sirloin Salad, Asian-Glazed Chicken on Field Greens, Half Rack of Baby Back Ribs and Dragonfire Chicken, \$6.99 - \$8.99; **TGI Friday's**, Concourse C. (6)



Q&A

Travelers often have interesting questions for the MSP Airport Public Affairs department. Here are a few of the latest, with answers.

Q: Is there a cell phone parking lot at MSP?

A: Yes, a new cell phone lot just opened to better accommodate those picking up arriving passengers at either the Lindbergh or Humphrey terminals. To find the cell phone lot, take the nearby Post Road exit off of Interstate 494 and follow the signs. The lot also provides an excellent vantage point for taking photos of airplanes during take-off and landing.

Q: Where can I get nachos at MSP?

A: There are a variety of options: *Itasca Grille* near gate C27 serves up chicken or beef nachos; the *Rock Bottom Brewery* at the junction of Concourses C & D provides chicken nachos and a veggie variety. On Concourse D the *Northern Lights Grill* serves chicken; the new *O’Gara’s* on Concourse F has ground beef or chicken; and on Concourse G chicken

and barbecue beef are available at *Tequileria*. *Northstar Crossing’s Axel’s Bonfire* serves both chicken and beef nachos.

Q: I have a long layover. Where can I comfortably take a nap and securely store carry-on baggage?

A: The upper level of *Northstar Crossing*, accessible by elevator or stairs, has rest areas with comfortable seating, including couches – take the elevator or stairs near the outdoor seating area of *Chili’s Too* on *Northstar Crossing*. Storage lockers to safely secure bags are available throughout the secure areas of the terminal. The lockers utilize fingerprint technology for security. The dimensions are 23” high by 15” wide and 35” deep.

Caffeinated Kicks: Finding Your Fix

There’s a terrific cup of coffee around nearly every corner at MSP Airport – from specialty coffee shops to restaurants. But maybe it’s time to put a fresh buzz in your day by trying something different. Our random survey of travelers and MSP Airport employees garnered favorites worth checking out.

The Coffee Shop Originator.

The year was 1971. The place, Seattle. Starbucks opened the doors of its original coffee shop in Pike Place Market. In the 1980s, espresso drinks were added. And the caffeine craze was in high gear. Now there are more than 10,000 stores worldwide, creating cups full of everything from the daily roast to frozen Frappuccino blended coffees; **Starbucks**, Lindbergh Main Terminal, Concourse C, and Lindbergh Terminal Baggage Claim.

Mightiest Caffeine Explosion.

The Depth Charge is taken to a high level of caffeination at **Dunn Bros Coffee**. They add not just one, but two shots of espresso to a standard cup of brewed coffee. The result is intense coffee flavor, super-charged to keep you alert through any cross-country flight. **Depth Charge**, \$2.19 - \$2.59; **Dunn Bros Coffee**, Lindbergh Concourse C and Humphrey Terminal Gate Level.

Most Dependably Organic.

Day after day, **Peoples Organic Coffee** is the pour of choice at **French Meadow Bakery & Café**. Sure, other coffee sources feature organics occasionally, but **Peoples Organic** is a commitment at **French Meadow**. Shade grown, 100% fair trade and locally roasted, it’s ecologically sound. And deeply delicious. Regular or decaf, 16 oz. to-go cup, \$2.12; **French Meadow Bakery & Café**, Lindbergh Main Terminal and Concourse F.

Best Place for Irish Coffee.

O’Gara’s sports an Irish pub theme, so it’s a must for the real-deal spiked coffee. Made with **Jameson’s Irish Whiskey**, fresh hot coffee, sugar, topped with a dollop of whipped cream and served in a footed glass mug, it’s a wee bit of coffee heaven. **Irish Coffee**, \$8.18; **O’Gara’s Bar & Grill**, Concourse F.

Best Coffee in an Ice Cream.

This one’s a tie – the **Dairy Queen MooLatte** is a frozen wonder in three flavors – Mocha (the most popular), Cappuccino or French Vanilla, \$4.49 - \$5.59; **DQ Grill & Chill**, Concourse C. And then, there’s **Coffee, Coffee BuzzBuzzBuzz** ice cream, a punch of espresso roasted coffee ice cream with espresso bean fudge chunks in a cup or a cone, \$3.51 - \$5.31; **Ben & Jerry’s**; Lindbergh Main Terminal.

Best Coffee for a Crowd.

Got a big group on a layover? Holding a meeting of colleagues at your gate? Keep everyone perky with the **Caribou Canteen** – 96 ounces of brewed coffee in a to-go dispenser, complete with cups. It’s not only handy, but a real value. **The Caribou Canteen**, \$12; **Caribou Coffee**, Lindbergh Main Terminal and Concourses E, F & A, and Humphrey Terminal Baggage Claim.

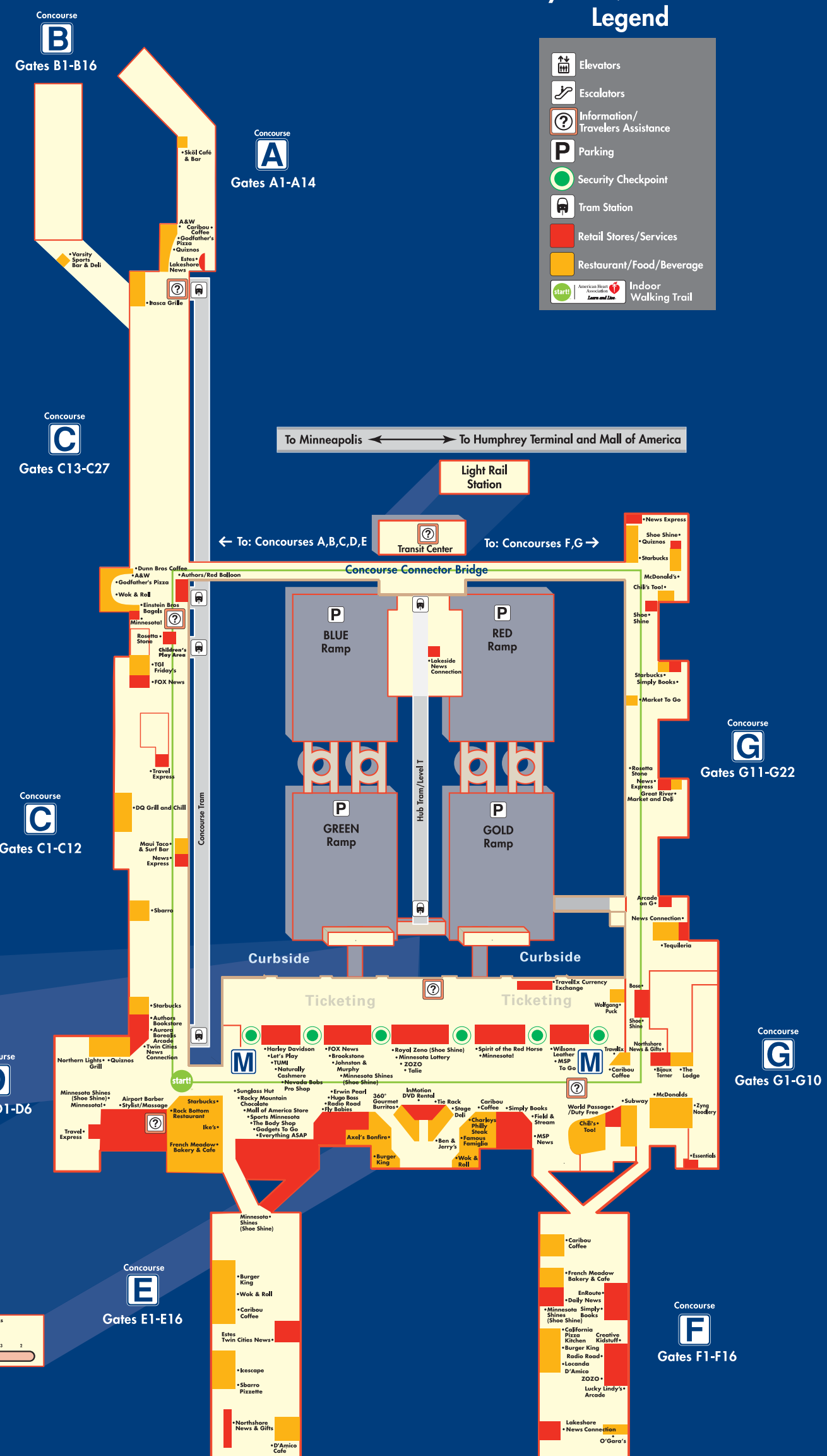
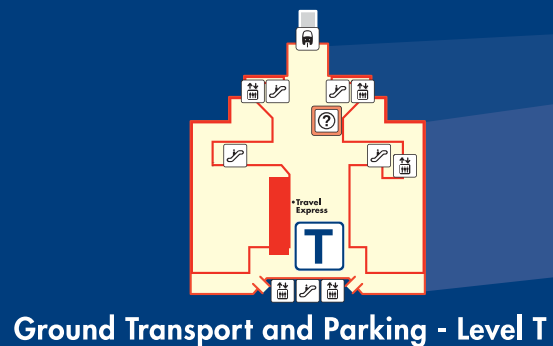
